More Summer Events for Your Diaries:-

Pershore Open Gardens on the weekend for the NGS - Pershore Gardens, Pershore, Worcestershire WR10 1BG. Runnung on Sat 11, Sun 12 June (1-5). Combined adm £7.50, Children free. Refreshments at selected gardens as indicated on the map/description sheet. Times:13:00 to 17:00. Most years about twenty gardens open in Pershore. This small town has been opening gardens as part of the NGS for 50 years, almost continuously. In the early days the open gardens were in the Georgian heart of the town but now, gardens open from all over the town. Some gardens are surprisingly large, well over an acre, while others are courtyard gardens. All have their individual appeal and present great variety.

The wealth of pubs, restaurants and cafes offer ample opportunities for refreshment while the Abbey and the River Avon are some of the many points of interest in this market town. Tickets, which take the form of a map and garden descriptions, are valid for both days. They can be purchased starting a week before the event at Blue in Broad Street or at the Town Hall.

On the weekend they can be bought at Number 8 Community Arts Centre in the High Street and any open garden. Gardens are open all over the town including Bridge street B4084, Broad Street, Newlands, Defford Road, Station road, Cherry Orchard, Priest Lane & Hunter Rise (off Three Springs Road).

Will and Audrie Scott's "Walled Garden" is off Fort Royal Hill in Worcester and is open for the NGS on Wednesday 29th June 2022 (1 to 5). It's a fascinating and historic garden with a focus on herbs and their uses and is well worth a visit. Again details are in the Worcestershire NGS Yellow Book or on their website.

BLACK PEAR GARDENING CLUB 10th ANNIVERSARY.

During a committee meeting earlier this year it was mentioned that the BPGC will be 10 years old this September, something I hadn't realised and it was suggested that we should organise something to celebrate the occasion. As one of the founder members, I thought it was very touching that they wished to do so.

Following extensive testing, by some committee members, We have booked The Woodhouse at Apple Tree Kitchen, Clifton Upon Teme, for August 20th at 12 noon. The Woodhouse is a large, high-ceilinged, oak beamed function room newly built in a traditional style with a rustic wooden bar. The Woodhouse can formally seat 50 people we will have exclusive use of the Woodhouse and its facilities and the patio outside, with the Woodhouse dedicated waiting staff to look after us.

Tea or Filter Coffee will be served on arrival.

Lunch will be a Classic Buffet of Hand Carved Slow Cooked ham, with Quiche Lorraine, Cheese and Onion Slice and Vegetarian Quiche, Mixed Salad, Pasta Salad, Roast Vegetable and Couscous and a Cheeseboard with 3 kinds of cheese, crackers, fruit and nuts.

The Apple Tree Kitchen is Set within 25 acres of landscaped gardens and orchards with picturesque views over the Teme Valley. There is also a cafe where afternoon teas and cake can be purchased separately. I think this will be a wonderful way to celebrate our ten years.

The cost for the lunch will be £25 per head, we have had to guarantee a minimum booking of 30. Booking forms are included with this newsletter.
